Aims and Scope

Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics is a peer-reviewed journal that covers the field of climate change and environmental issues. Subject areas include: climate change policy, environmental law, sustainable development policy and climate change security. The purpose of the journal is to provide a means of exchange among those working in different disciplines on problems related to climate change and environmental issues. To promote lively exchanges of views amongst scholars and experts around the globe, the *Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics* Editorial Board welcomes the submission of relevant articles and conference reports on all environmental issues pertaining to the Asia-Pacific region. The journal also includes vigorous editorial and book review sections.

Submission Deadlines

Articles submitted to *Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development: Law, Economics and Politics* will be reviewed on a rolling basis. However, the dates below can serve as a general point of reference for submissions:

- April issue: December 31
- October issue: June 30

Submission Guidelines

Authors are requested to kindly submit manuscripts in the following manner:

1. Submission Declaration

Submission of an article implies that the work described has not been published previously (except in the form of an abstract or as part of a published lecture or academic thesis), that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, that its publication is approved by all authors and tacitly or explicitly by the responsible authorities where the work was carried out, and that, if accepted, it will not be published elsewhere including electronically in the same form, in English or in any other language, without the written consent of the copyright-holder.

2. Format

1. The length of the MS-word text, including Footnotes, normally should be approximately **6,000 words**.
2. Authors should include the Reference of the article.
3. Authors should include biographical information about their current career positions, organizational affiliations, its addresses and email addresses.

4. Authors should enclose an abstract of 200 words (± 20 words).
5. Authors should follow the footnotes format as outlined below and other editorial style of the *Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics* format. Articles must be submitted before the relevant submission deadlines, and sent via e-mail to the editor at csdlap@naver.com.

Number tables consecutively in accordance with their appearance in the text. Place footnotes to tables below the table body and indicate them with superscript lowercase letters. Avoid vertical rules. Be sparing in the use of tables and ensure that the data presented in tables do not duplicate results described elsewhere in the article.

Research Ethic Rules

Article 1 (Objectives)

The fundamental objectives of the Research Ethics Rules ('the Rules' hereafter) shall be to provide ethical guidelines in submitting a manuscript for publication at ***Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics***.

Article 2 (Guidelines)

All scholarly materials submitted to ***Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics*** shall comply with the following rules. :

1. Manuscripts shall be original and not be previously published, be previously accepted for publication, be not under consideration by any other publisher, and not to be submitted elsewhere until a decision is finalized at ***Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics***.
2. All authors should be aware that manuscripts should not include plagiarized contents. Plagiarism takes many forms, from 'passing off' another's paper as the author's own paper, to copying or paraphrasing substantial parts of another's paper (without attribution), to claiming results from research conducted by others. Plagiarism in all its forms

constitutes unethical publishing behavior and is unacceptable.

3. Proper and specific citation to sources shall be made when the author cites other scholarly materials.

Article 3 (Self-Citation)

1. Scholarly materials that authors reference their own prior publications can be submitted to *Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics*. However, the process needs to be clearly identified.
2. The First Clause of Article 3 also equally applies when authors cite their own master's or doctorate thesis that have not been published in other periodicals or journals.

Article 4 (Translation)

When submitting translated version of other author's scholarly materials (in any language), the written consent has to be attached from the copyright holder of the original work.

Article 5 (Overlapping Contribution)

While the final decision on the publication of authors' manuscript has not been made, authors could submit the same manuscripts to more than one journal publication. However, given the final decision for publication at *Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics*, authors should take the responsibility to prevent

overlapping publication.

Article 6 (Sanctions for Violation)

When authors violate the Rules, following actions could be taken.

1. Redemption of already paid submission fee or all or parts of research subsidy.
2. Prohibition of submission to *Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics* for at least 6 months up to 3 years according to the extent
3. Announcement at *Asian Journal of Climate Change and Sustainable Development : Law, Economics and Politics* in regards to the authors' violation of the Rules.

Article 7 (Amendment)

The Rules could be amended by resolutions of Editorial Board.
